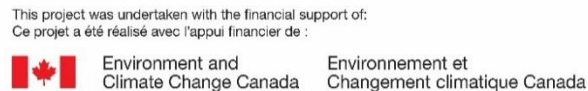

| <p><b>Primary Surveyor Experience:</b> <b>Novice</b> - No frog call survey experience; <b>Beginner</b> - 1 season of surveys; <b>Intermediate</b> - 2-5 seasons of surveys; <b>Expert</b> - More than 5 seasons</p> <p><b>Wind Speed (Beaufort Scale):</b> <b>0</b> - smoke rises vertically; <b>1</b> - smoke drifts; <b>2</b> - leaves rustle; <b>3</b> - light branches sway; <b>4</b> - branches move *Do not survey in &gt;3</p> <p><b>Precipitation:</b> <b>N</b> - none; <b>LR</b> - light rain; <b>MR</b> - moderate rain; <b>HR</b> - heavy rain *Do not survey in MR or HR</p> <p><b>Background Noise:</b> <b>0</b> - No noise; <b>1</b> - Distant (e.g. traffic or animal calls including other frogs in distance); <b>2</b> - Faint (e.g. few cars pass nearby, periodic animal calls, wind rustling vegetation); <b>3</b> - Moderate (e.g. frogs heard well but there is fairly consistent noise from cars passing, birds calling, wind rustling vegetation); <b>4</b> - Consistent (e.g. frogs can be heard but not easily and there is continuous noise from animals, traffic or wind); <b>5</b> - Loud (e.g. ability to hear frogs is severely compromised due to continuous loud noise from highway traffic).</p> <p><b>Call Codes:</b> <b>0</b> - No frogs heard; <b>1</b>- Calls not overlapping and # of calling frogs can be accurately counted; <b>2</b>- Some calls overlapping but the number of calling frogs can be reliably counted; <b>3</b> - Full chorus with continuous overlapping calls indistinguishable from one another.</p> |            |                     |                   |                                   |               |                  |  |           |               |                       |               |
